In addition to the health of the RV, it's wise to have routes mapped out beforehand. Your route plans should include where you will stop for gas, what RV resorts you'll be staying at, or potential rest stops for taking breaks. Aside from the stops you'll be making, it's also important to remember that RV's are bigger than the average vehicle, so be aware of the potential size restrictions you will face on the road. Be sure that your route is free from low bridges or anything else that may obstruct your RV's path. With proper preparation, using tools like RV GPS or Trucker Atlas, your route can be as stress-free as possible.

Once you're all packed up and ready to leave, there are a few things that can make driving your RV easier. First, maintain a nice, manageable speed. RVs are not built for speed and putting them under extra stress can lead to unnecessary wear and tear on your vehicle. Ensure that there is room along your route for the wide turns that you'll need to use in order to maneuver your RV. Wide turns are less stressful to deal with when there is less traffic on the road, so plan to drive through cities outside of peak drive times. Can't make that happen? Find a scenic route that has you avoid the city altogether! Finally, be adaptable. Sometimes there are certain things that are out of your control, such as weather, road construction, or traffic. Be sure to remain calm, take the breaks you need to stay level-headed, and be ready to put together a Plan B, if needed!

Try to schedule your drive so that you arrive to your site a few hours before the sun goes down. This will help you locate potential problems with your site and make setting up camp easier and safer. Remove any rocks or debris that could be a trip hazard. If campfires are allowed, ensure that they are out of reach of anything flammable and a safe distance from the RV. When you use the fire area, be sure to keep water nearby in case of any stray flames. Finally, make sure there aren't any gullies or ditches that could become problematic if it rains. The last thing you want is for your RV to get

stuck in the mud! With everything secure and the RV set up, now you can start enjoying the amenities of the RV resort you're staying at!
